Nana: Don't worry, Lily. I really want to go with you! Let's have fun together!

Lily: Thank you, Nana. I'm looking forward to it.

この対話文を読んで、～に入る最も適当な英文を、それぞれあとのア～エのうちから一つずつ選び、その符号を書きなさい。

Masaru: What's your favorite sport in America?

Joe: I play football, so I like football the best.

Masaru: You mean soccer?

Joe: No, no. I mean American football. Here's my picture.

When we say

Masaru: I don't know much about American football. I've never watched a game.

Joe: It is very exciting.

Masaru: Is American football popular in the UK, too?

Joe: I don't think so. A lot of people in the UK love soccer... I mean "football."

Masaru: Are you saying they call soccer "football" in the UK?

Joe: Yes, I am. The word "football" can mean different sports in different countries.

Soccer is just one of these sports.

Masaru: That sounds interesting! There must be a lot of different kinds of football in the world.

Hey, let's play Japanese football!

Joe: Oh?

Masaru: Actually, there's no Japanese football, but we have a game called *kemari*. You kick the ball up in the air and pass it to other players. You lose when the ball touches the ground. Come on, Joe!
